## **Ground Breaking News!**

n January of 2012, shovels will begin digging the first new set of latrines for the school. Soon after, classrooms will be constructed, marking the beginning of PHASE 1. Thanks to donations from people like you, the Construction Committee feels that sufficient funds will be raised by December, 2011 to break ground.



## Interesting details PHASE 1:

- \* Three new banks of pit latrines will be builtone for boys, girls and teachers. They will be constructed of bricks-termites infect wooden structures!
- \* The first 4 of 8 classrooms are also in this phase. The teachers and village elders feel the older students should be educated in the new classrooms...giving the younger students something to look forward to.



ave you met cousins, *Mathon Noi* and *Sebastian Maroundit*? If you have, you surely will remember them and their personal story.



If you haven't...they are the co-founders of Building Minds In Sudan (BMIS), a 501 c 3 non-profit organization which is building a school in their home village of Mayen-Abun in the new Republic of South Sudan. Fleeing for their lives as children, due to a civil war that arrived at their doorstep, they walked over 1,000 miles on their journey with other "Lost Boys of Sudan". Refugee camps in Ethiopia and Kenya housed them for 11 years before they were relocated by the United Nations to Rochester, NY in 2001. They have lived, studied and worked here since then. They are now following the American way of life of "giving back" by building a school in their home village. The mission of BMIS is to help these young men achieve their dreams.


